

Comparative content analyses of the laws in B&H

- Over 20 Laws governing the issue of foster care
- Protocol for content analyses (categories: users; rights; jurisdiction; financing)
- Concepts:

 \checkmark juvenile, underage person, children without parental care – child (under 18 years)

 \checkmark foster care – accommodation in other family / synonyms

Similarities:

• B&H legislation doesn't differentiate accommodation in foster family and

accommodation in the extended family.

• Through the institute of guardianship all Family Laws in B&H provide special

protection to the children without parental care

- Nowhere in the Law is specified whether the foster parent is the guardian
- Placement in another family / as a form of intervention (Family

Situational protection analysis of the children without parental care in **B&H**

- The child protection system in B&H, Analysis of situation (IBHI B&H and UNICEF, 2007)
- Analysis of the situation of children without parental care and/or children at threat of losing parental care based on children's rights (SOS Children's Villages, Bosnia and Herzegovina, 2008 and 2010)
- Analysis of legislative and budgetary allocations for categories of children without parental care and families at threat of separation in Federation of B&H

Features of foster care in Bosnia and Herzegovina

Finance / Budget- territorial discrimination, different sources of funding

Representation of foster care- residential care as the dominant

Record- data that contains information of the number of children in foster care are incomplete (particularly in kinship families)

Tracking: lack of professional supervision and monitoring after accommodation with foster families (particularly in kinship families); lack of standardized procedures of support and supervision of foster parents

Contact with biological parents and relatives: it is not recognized as a right of the child (no systematic records, support, evaluation of contacts)

Children without parental care in kinship/extended families- about 80%

Funding / budget of foster care in B&H

FB&H

• Compensations for the placement of a child in foster care / territorial discrimination - there is no compliance between the cantons

• Irregular payment of compensation for existential cost of children in foster care (Analysis of policy implementation of Federation B&H, 2010)

RS

• The Ministry determines the amount of compensation, but it is not funding for it

•Investment in the social, family and children protection from 2006 to 2010- no special grants for foster parents, children in foster care or foster care promotion

Representation: Foster care vs. residential care in B&H

•2001-2006.

Slight decrease of the number of children placed in foster care in B&H (SOS Children's Villages, Bosnia and Herzegovina, 2008)

•2005 - 2009

• Number of children without parental care that are placed with foster families is not increased (Analysis of policy implementation in Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, 2010)

•Data analysis of republican and entity institute for statistics - number of children placed in a foster family is not increased in RS (2002-2010)

The records of foster care in B&H

- The lack of an efficient system of records of users of social services (adequate database)
- Incomplete data of the number of children in foster care (particularly in kinship/extended family)
- Officialy about 2 000 children are without parental care, but unofficial estimates put the number between 3 000 and 4 000 children (SOS Children's Villages, B&H, 2010)
- Data obtained by different research are not consistent with official data

Kinship and non-relation care

- RS: The majority of children in foster care are placed with their
 extended family (from 85% to 90%), but certain number of these children is not registered
- Federation of B&H: The largest number of children in foster care are placed in extended families
- Non-relation foster care is insufficiently developed
- Non-relation foster care is unequally developed

Monitoring the process of foster care in B&H

Department of Statistics of B&H

 \circ Clear evidence of institutional care

o Foster care- partly`hidden zone`

• The lack of professional supervision and follow-up of responsible professionals and foster family - mostly inordinately, without adequate plans, and only in `emergency cases` (Ministry of Health and Welfare RS, 2008)

Conslusions

- Over 20 Laws governing the issue of foster care
- Laws elaborate common places the adoption of bylaws are left to administration
- The conditions for the implementation of the law do not follow the development of legislation
- The lack of accredited training programs of professionals and foster parents
- The absence of a unified database of foster families
- Not exist continuous monitoring, support, supervision and control of the process of foster care

Positive developement shifts:

- Development of strategic documents which significantly include the rights of children, much more than does the B&H legislation
- Improving cooperation between governmental and non-governmental sectors

Conlusions

Positive developement shifts:

- Analysis of the implementation of relevant strategies - monitoring of realisation of strategic objectives
- Recognizing the importance of adequate records, funding, preparation and monitoring of foster care process
- Programs of foster care development (Tuzla, Sarajevo, Banja Luka, Trebinje)
- Active associations of foster parents
