

Survey – Reducing discrimination in funding/calls for proposals

Dear parents and scientists,

Due to the multiple instances of discrimination experienced by parents and other unpaid care workers in the scientific community, we would like to collect information on experiences of discrimination with third-party funding programs.

Perhaps you have had such experiences yourself, or stumbled across questionable wording, deadlines, etc. in calls for funding (e.g., the lack of supplementary child benefits in fellowships abroad)?

Our goal is to draw attention to these experiences and the exclusion they create. In the longer term, the aim is to put an end to structural (intersectional) discrimination against parents and other unpaid care workers in the scientific community.

For this purpose, we have created a short survey to capture these experiences, which we invite you to complete. The tool we have chosen for this is Lime Survey. The survey takes 5-10 minutes.
