Power and Authority in Governance Networks: Protecting Human Rights through

Nongovernmental Actors in the Context of Limited Statehood

**Abstract** 

The project looks at the interaction of international governmental organizations (IGOs) and

nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) in governance-networks in the context of limited

statehood. Intending to gain insights in the sources and relations of political authority in

governance networks, the analysis pursues two interconnected goals. First, it aims to discover

the constellations, strategies and processes of IGO-NGO-interaction in the field of human

rights protection at different stages of the mandate. Second, it asks for the sources of power

and authority and how NGOs make use of them. To address these questions, the project

employs empirical case studies in the field of human rights protection, focusing on a selected

number of local and international NGOs working with women and refugees in Lebanon and

Bosnia-Herzegovina and the UN institutions involved.
