BREITSCHIED:

The Breitscheid show cave is part of the larger Herbstlabyrinth-Adventhöhle cave system in Hesse, which is the largest connected cave system in the state. The known system is more than 12 to 13 kilometers long, while the public section is much smaller and includes the Knöpfchenhalle, a major chamber with many types of dripstone formations. The cave was opened to visitors in 2009, has a constant temperature of about 9°C, and also contains 30,000-year-old cave bear bones.

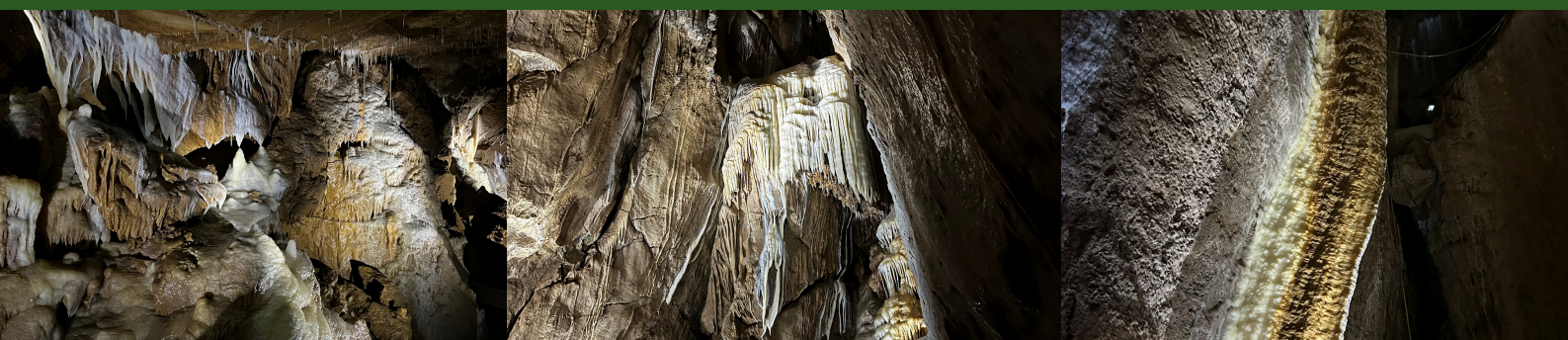

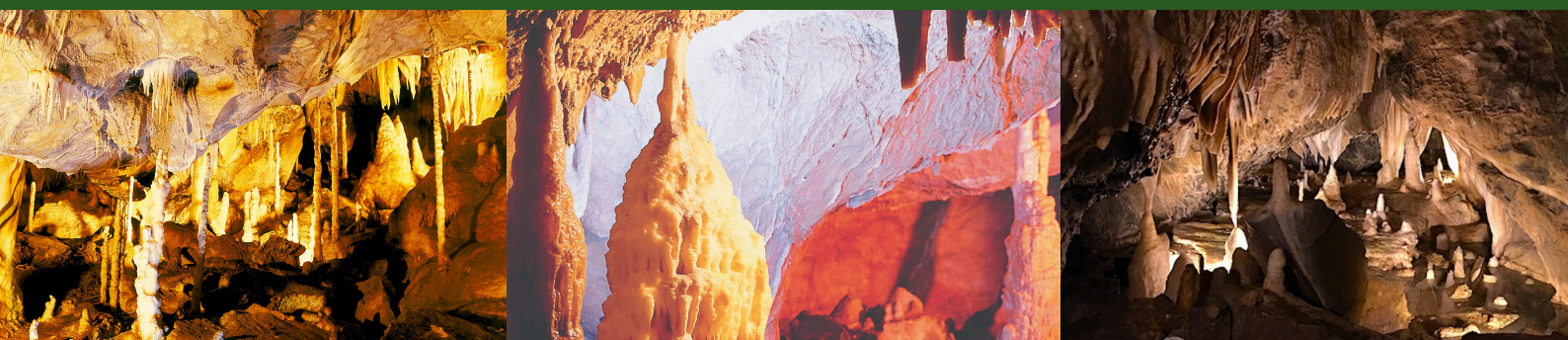

ATTA-KÄSE/ CHEESE:

Attakäse is a cheese from the Atta-Region in Germany. Its initial ten weeks are spent inside a traditional dairy room. After the ten weeks it is moved inside of the cave where it spends another ten to twelve months aging on special wooden shelves. The aging conditions give it a distinct taste, texture and look.

ATTA CAVE

Atta Cave, or Atta-Höhle, is a dripstone cave in Attendorn, Germany, and is one of the largest and most visited show caves in the country. The cave was discovered in 1907 during limestone quarrying, and its total length is about 6,670 to 6,740 meters, with around 1,800 meters open to visitors. Inside, the temperature stays constant at 9°C, and the cave is known for stalactites, stalagmites, stalagnates, and colorful calcite formations.
