Katrin Horn is professor of Gender Studies at the Institute for British and North American Studies of the University of Greifswald, where she also serves as the speaker of the Interdisciplinary Center for Gender Studies.

She publishes on various issues of gender, feminism, and queerness in popular media, and the literature and culture of the late nineteenth century. Among others, she is the author of Women? Camp?and.Popular.Culturei.Serious.Excess (Palgrave, 2017) and co-editor of American.Cultures. as.Transnational.Performance;Traces?Commons?Skills (Routledge, 2022) and Speculative. Endeavorsi.Cultures.of.Knowledge.and.Capital.in.the.Long.Nineteenth.Century (Manchester UP, 2025).
