Kinohi Nishikawa teaches African American literature and culture at Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey, USA. He is the author of *Street Players: Black Pulp Fiction and the Making of a Literary Underground*, which was published by the University of Chicago Press in 2018.

The author of numerous essays, articles, and chapters in African American book history, bibliography, and print culture studies, Nishikawa's most recent publications have appeared in *ASAP/Journal*, *American Literary History*, and *Novel: A Forum on Fiction*.

He is currently at work on the edited collection *Sites of Memory: Toni Morrison and the Archive* (with Autumn M. Womack) and on a monograph, *Black Paratext: Reading African American Literature by Design*.
