

What is a MUN?

Model United Nations (MUN) is a conference where high school and university students from all over the world come together to simulate international politics.

Every participant plays the role of a diplomat representing the position of her/his assigned country in a simulated session of a committee of the United Nations, such as the Security Council and the General Assembly.

Therefore, all participants research positions of their country, investigate international issues, debate, deliberate, consult and then develop solutions to todays problems together.
